Joana Manuel is a Portuguese actress and singer. She studied Singing at the Escola Superior de Música de Lisboa, where she later taught.

She was a member of the Gulbenkian Choir for eight years, a vocalist with the group El Sur, has worked in dubbing and voice-over since 1998, and has published two books: 'O Espelho Invertido' and 'Outro Texto' with Douada Correria.

On stage, she has built a career defined by rigour and breadth, working as a performer, co-creator and vocal coach alongside directors and artists such as Fernando Gomes, Ricardo Pais, Olga Roriz, Giorgio Barberio Corsetti, Victor Hugo Pontes, Fernanda Lapa, Nuno Carinhas and Teatro Praga, among many others. On television, she has appeared in acclaimed series such as 'Auga Seca' (RTP/HBO), 'Vanda' (Opto), 'Os Eleitos', 'Amar Demais' and 'Lisbon Noir'.

In film, her credits include 'Vampires in Space', screened at the Venice Art Biennale, work with António Pedro Vasconcelos, and the feature film 'Portugueses', directed by Vicente Alves do Ó.
