Lucas Dutra is a Portuguese actor, director, and screenwriter whose career combines acting with filmmaking and screenwriting. He graduated with a degree in Film from Middlesex University in London, specializing in directing and screenwriting.

In theatre, his career includes appearances in productions such as 'Oliver Twist' and the international musical show 'Trouble', under the direction of the prestigious American filmmaker Gus Van Sant. On television, he began his career with roles in series such as 'Os Nossos Dias' and 'Bem-vindos a Beirais', subsequently joining the cast of productions like 'Circo Paraíso', 'A Prisioneira', 'Bem Me Quer', 'Cacau', and 'Amor à Prova', among others. Internationally, he portrayed the character Niketas in the third season of the series 'Vikings: Valhalla' (Netflix). Concurrently, he directed the series '#NaWeb' and won the Revelation of the Year Award at the XXVII Portuguese Golden Globes, in addition to being recognized at the '#TikTokShortFilm' competition of the Cannes Film Festival for writing and directing the short film '(Nós) Na Cabeça'.

In cinema, he made his big-screen debut in the feature films 'Revolução (Sem) Sangue', directed by Rui Pedro Silva, and 'Hotel Amor', directed by Hermano Moreira. His career also features a leading role in the international horror production 'Dangerous Games to Play', directed by Ángel Gómez Hernández.

As a director, his short film 'Do Outro Lado' won the Best Film award at the Filmapalooza festival, securing a spot at the Cannes Short Film Market.
